Preservation of Wilson Fine Art Show –

Work inspired by historic architecture and landscape similar, but not directly linked, to that in the Old Wilson Mile

Deadline to enter: March 30, 2010

Call to Artists: Preservation of Wilson invites all artists to enter a Fine Art Show using inspiration drawn from the historic architecture and landscape similar to that of the Old Wilson Mile, a one-mile area located in the Old Wilson Historic District. Work does not have to be directly linked to the Mile, but with inspiration drawn from the area. We are looking for work that represents what is common to a residential historic neighborhood in an urban setting. There is no entry fee.

Open to all artists working in any medium. Art work must be ready to hang, framed or with a 2 inch gallery wrap. Work must be no older than one year and never shown before. All art pieces are available for sale with no commission. Please provide an easel or stand for your work.

Exhibit period: Opening reception will be held May 16 at the 3rd Annual Preservation of Wilson Garden Party at the home of Betty Lou and Henry Walston, 904 West Nash Street, West Nash Historic District, Wilson, NC. The art work will then be moved and displayed at the Hammond Gallery during the month of May, offering exhibit time during the 2010 season of Theater of the American South.

Inspiration drawn from historic architecture, landscape & community life similar to that of the Old Wilson Mile – but not linked directly: All work must come from inspiration generated from the historic architecture, landscape, and/or any aspect of community life as found similar to that in The Old Wilson Mile. The Mile begins at the entrance of Barton College, runs east down Vance Street, right on Hill Street, and right on Green Street, down Gray Street and onto Whitehead and then back to Vance returning to the entrance of Barton College.
